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GUERCINO DRAWINGS FROM WINDSOR CASTLE AT KIMBELL ART MUSEUM DECEMBER 14-FEBRUARY 16

A major exhibition of sixty drawings by Guercino from the collection of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II at the Royal Library, Windsor Castle, one of the highlights of the 400th anniversary celebration of the Italian Baroque artist's birth, will open at the Kimbell Art Museum in Fort Worth, Texas December 14, 1991 to February 16, 1992. This exhibition, which travels in 1992 to Washington's National Gallery of Art (March 15-May 17) before concluding its three-city American tour at The Drawing Center in New York (June 2-August 1), draws upon the unrivaled resources of the Royal Collection.

Giovanni Francesco Barbieri (1591-1666), better known as Il Guercino (the Squinter), was one of the seventeenth century's greatest painters. As a young man, he astounded the best painters in Bologna by his talents as a fine draftsman and excellent colorist. By midcentury he was famous throughout Europe and received an invitation from King Charles I of England and from Louis XIII of France. His patrons included popes, monarchs, princes, cardinals, and ambassadors, for whom he and his busy workshop produced some 106 altarpieces and another 144 pictures.

Guercino's achievements as a draftsman were equally remarkable. Only Rembrandt and Rubens surpassed him in all of (more)

Europe in the seventeenth century. His exceptional ability to evoke the subtleties of light and tone, irrespective of the medium he employed, and his remarkable rapidity of touch are the abiding and constant qualities of Guercino's drawings. By capturing delicate gradations of light and suggesting movement he endowed his subjects with great naturalism without detracting from their nobility and classicism. Guercino's prolific output was in large part dependent on his activity as a painter and on his lifelong habit of diligently preparing his pictures with working studies.

The drawings by Guercino, his school, and his followers preserved in the Royal Library at Windsor Castle constitute the largest and most representative group to have remained together anywhere in the world. Most of them were aquired in the eighteenth century and many have a provenance going directly back to the artist's heirs. They include drawings from every phase of his long and productive career, from compositional drawings, studies of groups of figures and of single figures, to caricatures and landscapes. Because of its size and comprehensiveness, the collection provides a rare opportunity for the study of the manifold aspects of Guercino's graphic work.

Selected by the staff of the Royal Library in consultation with the borrowing institutions, the exhibition is accompanied by a fully illustrated, critical catalogue prepared by Nicholas Turner, assistant keeper in the department of prints and drawings

at the British Museum and author with Sir Denis Mahon of the definitive catalogue of the Windsor Guercino holdings published in 1989 by Cambridge University Press. The exhibition catalogue will focus on the artistic qualities and appreciation of the drawings, as well as their function and history. The inauguration of the exhibition in Fort Worth will feature a lecture by Mr. Turner on December 13 at 6:30 p.m.; admission will be reserved for Kimbell Art Museum patrons.

Guercino Drawings from Windsor Castle is one of a number of exhibitions taking place in Europe and North America to commemorate the artist's life and work on his 400th birthday. The major Guercino painting retrospective, on view this fall in Bologna and Frankfurt, will be shown in Washington in conjunction with the exhibition of Guercino drawings from Windsor Castle. The Kimbell Art Museum's recently acquired Portrait of a Lawyer by Guercino is featured in the painting survey.

Guercino Drawings from Windsor Castle is supported by an indemnity from the Federal Council on the Arts and the Humanities.
